

Use of Spaces Intended for Teens, Children, and Families

The Haddonfield Public Library has rooms and collections specifically designed to meet the needs of young library users. Adults may borrow materials from the children's and teen's collection on behalf of young library users or on their own behalf.

In the teen commons, children's program room and the children's collection room, resources such as tables, computers, and seating for individual reading are reserved for the use of young library users and accompanying adults. Adults that are not accompanying teens/children and do not require immediate access to teen/children's materials will be asked to relocate to another section of the library, regardless of the time of day, presence or absence of other teens/children, or activity level in the room. Tutors may only be in these spaces for a period that begins ten minutes before and ends ten minutes after the appointment with the child and must adhere to all library rules and policies.

Behavior of minors or adults in the room must follow the library's general code of conduct and any other applicable rules or policies.
